Here is a summary of some of their findings.

- When kids are taught the skills needed to build relationships, increase self and social awareness, and make responsible decisions, it leads to life-long mental wellness, academic and career success.
- Over 80% of parents and teachers, as well as most high school students think it's important to prioritize social and emotional programming in childcare settings and schools.
- For every dollar invested in social-emotional learning programming, there is an \$11 return on investment in long-term benefits to the student and to the community.

God's Word speaks of the importance of healthy relationships. Educators, social workers, and government leaders speak of the importance of prioritizing social and emotional programing, and they go as far as showing what kind of return we can expect from the resources we invest in these programs.

For over fifty years, Silver Birch Ranch has been a place that has served our nation's churches, youth, and families. We see the importance of people gathering together, learning together, serving together, and worshipping together. We understand the vital role various activities and experiences play in creating a healthy community. We see the barriers that were built between people crumble as students live, play, and learn together.

One of the things that makes camp unique is the opportunity to get away from the busyness of life and enjoy being immersed in God's creation. I've heard many of our campers, both young and old, reference camp as being their "happy place." In a lot of ways, camp is a place where people can unplug and refocus on relationships – our relationships with others, but even more importantly, our relationship with God. I think now, more than ever, that is exactly what we need.

Each summer, for as long as I can remember, SBR welcomes a group of people called Summer Staff. Our Summer Staff is primarily made up of college-age students who have been called to invest their entire summer to help make summer camp happen. Many of you might have even been a Summer Staffer at some point (perhaps under a different name at the

time). I draw attention to our Summer Staff because I see them as a perfect example of the importance of being able to get away and focus on relationships. Indeed, they help us run and facilitate many of our activity areas at camp, but in the process, they are surrounded by relationships. As a supervisor of some of these staffers, it's been amazing to see the transformation that takes place from beginning to the end of summer. Besides the strengthening of friendships that takes place, seeing the deepening in their relationship with God is second to none. Since many of the "normal" distractions are gone at camp, it creates an opportunity to focus on God. The atmosphere pushes them to lean more into their relationship with Jesus on a daily basis. As a result, transformation happens.

Camp creates a platform to embody what Psalm 46:10 encourages: "Be still and know that I am God." Camp provides an environment where we can turn down the "volume" of everything that is going on around us so that we can hear the whispers of God's voice in our lives. As a college student, and a former Summer Staffer myself, I remember writing these words in a poem:

"I long for the Silence
The place of His embrace
Where He comes alive and speaks to me
Knowing and seeing the warmth of His grace
Silence is the place I want to be."
