NEW PROGRAM AT SBR AND WRR: FOSTER FAMILY CONNECT

The first goal was to serve the local church with a place for evangelism and to develop leadership. In that, our summer camps continue to look for ways to serve the church in those two areas.

In order to meet the continual challenges our culture has faced, we started various branches of ministry that now include the Nicolet Bible Institute, the Wolf River Refuge, Relate 365, and soon we will be branching out to include a ministry called Foster Family Connect. (fosterfamilyconnect.org)

We have seen the need that many counties in Wisconsin have in meeting the challenges of caring for those in foster care. We are hoping that we can be used to encourage many churches to have organized efforts to meet the various challenges in their communities so that the church is a place the county governments look to for help.

This ministry is very catalytic in nature as we hope to be the spark

that stokes the flame of family reconciliation, and we believe that we, the Church, should take the lead.

Silver Birch Ranch will be a place that encourages and trains. We are working at training and developing a horse mentoring program, we will make the Wolf River Refuge available for training and respite, and we hope to develop some foster care camps there one day, and to provide unique educational opportunities to help encourage and equip those involved in caring for foster care children.

We also hope to find the financial backing in each county to enable any children in foster care, and in the specific county, the opportunity to attend summer camp.

As the children attend summer camp, we will work towards having the local churches involved as camp counselors, which, once again, brings us back to the part that does not change.
