LEADERSHIP: CAUGHT MORE THAN TAUGHT

And he sat down and called the twelve. And he said to them, "If anyone would be first, he must be last of all and servant of all." And he took a child and put him in the midst of them, and taking him in his arms, he said to them, "Whoever receives one such child in my name receives me, and whoever receives me, receives not me but him who sent me." Mark 9:35-37 (ESV)

Servant leadership is the hallmark of all Christians. Jesus, who was in a position to be served by all, came to serve. The church is called to serve, and as they serve, they create community, a community that lasts a lifetime.

Servant leadership is demonstrated best when those who are in positions of leadership serve those who have nothing with which to repay them. History will judge those who served the widows, orphans, and children, instead of themselves, as "great leaders."

Even though we agree that servant leadership is critical, and we teach servant leadership from our lecterns and pulpits, and we have books dedicated to this concept, we still seem, at times, anemic at best in producing this kind of leader.

Perhaps this is because the definition of servant leader has changed to mean that we serve when it is convenient or benefits our own personal interest. Perhaps it has become more of academic pursuit, or something we have heard so often, that it has now fallen on deaf ears.

Whatever the reason for its demise, Silver Birch Ranch remains on the front line of training young people to serve, whether they are junior high students who come to rake leaves, high school students who volunteer to do a dish crew, or college students who choose to learn servanthood at the Nicolet Bible Institute, or by being at Silver Birch to serve as a volunteer/staff for the summer.

The need for training in servanthood has not diminished, and since servanthood is something that is caught, and is the most important ingredient in developing community, we once again invite you to consider the many opportunities Silver Birch Ranch affords your family and church to learn, practice, and demonstrate servanthood.

Young people benefit from being in an environment where you work hard for little or no pay for a cause that is greater than self. It has been a blessing to be a place that has focused on this aspect of training for over 50 years.

With that in mind, as we enter our 54th summer, I encourage families to consider encouraging their teen to first of all obtain skills (lifeguard, first aid skills, and more) that can be used to serve others, and then send them to camp to volunteer for some of the summer. I encourage college students to choose to come and learn leadership this summer, and I encourage parents, grandparents, and pastors to look to Silver Birch Ranch as a place to learn and demonstrate servanthood.

We look forward to serving the church again this summer, and we hope that many of our friends are planning to join us. Will you be a servant in this way?

Galatians 6:2 tells us to "Bear one another's burdens, and thereby fulfill the law of Christ." The Wolf River Refuge exists specifically for this purpose. We do this by "building relationships, investing in families." At WRR this mission is carried out in multiple ways.

First off, my intern, Jordan, and I clean cabins, rake leaves, send emails, prep firewood, and more. But the reason why we do these things isn't because fire is warm, emails are fun, or raking leaves is therapeutic. Instead, the reason why we do these things is to better facilitate the needs of our guests before and after their arrival.

Second, our mission is carried out by a variety of volunteers who are consistently involved in service projects, such as splitting wood, painting cabins, building new features like our pergola gathering space, or mowing. These volunteer visits are a tremendous help to us. But that's not why they're important. They're important because God is glorified in work done for others in His name. Their constant helping hands are a large contribution to this ministry, and its growing reach into homes and communities.

Third, our ministry is carried out by our guests by visiting WRR and committing time for each other—carrying each other's burdens by showing others Jesus, who takes their burdens away. In that way, every single person involved at the Wolf River Refuge, even just as reader of this article, is intricately involved in how the Wolf River Refuge stands as a place of healing and restoration.

That all being said, the fourth way that our mission is carried out is by praying for one another. As restored believers in Christ we have the privilege of being able to pray for one another. Learning to serve heartily as unto the Lord regardless of the assigned task is a vital element in the NBI program, but their service goes beyond a physical task completed. Why do we serve and include this so intentionally in our program? Is it not the very nature of God Himself? As we read in Philippians 2:7, we realize that Jesus Himself took on "the very nature of a servant." Serving is a God thing! The Lord set aside His dignity and glory to become a human being who served both the Father who sent Him and mankind who crucified Him. In our human nature, we serve ourselves, gravitating toward comfort and being catered to, and thus distorting what God had originally intended. In contrast, as a counter-cultural witness, the Lord Jesus instructs us in Matthew 23:11 that "the greatest among you will be your servant," and then He sends us out into all the world to love God and love people. At NBI, this missional focus continues to be our core calling as well.

IF ... you desire to identify with Christ and follow in His steps - be a servant.

IF ... your goal is to connect with people so that they may know and follow Christ as their Lord and Savior – be a servant.

IF ... you desire to hold a full-time job and honor God in the process – take up the towel - be a servant.

- IF ... you long to live life to its fullest and discover God's purpose for your life be a servant.
- IF ... you as a believer in Christ long to experience genuine God-given joy be a servant.
- IF ... you desire to grow in your faith in Christ, come to NBI and learn to be a servant.

May we say as the apostle Paul expressed in 2 Corinthians 4:5: "For we do not preach ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake."


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
